New Bethany Lutheran Church Constitution

Over the last few months, you may have heard during announcements that there was a group of people reviewing the Bethany church Constitution. We wanted to provide you with the latest updates as well as the next steps.

What is a Church Constitution?

A church's Constitution plays an important role as the broader body of mutually agreed upon principles and purposeful structure that govern the affairs and action of the church. It reflects the theology and polity of this church as it organizes itself to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ, share the sacraments, reach out to the neighbors with good news, and share the love of God in the world. It is also the common governing shared model across all our ELCA congregations.

A church's By-laws are a more specific description of the governance and operational activities of the church. More of a day-to-day operation view of how we accomplish the overall ELCA mission

A church's Constitution—unlike its Bylaws—should be difficult to amend, requiring much thought, deliberation, and prayer. These changes generally occur at the ELCA churchwide assemblies, which occur every three years.

Our By-laws will be reviewed, updated, and presented to the congregation for approval in a few months after the Constitution is approved.

Reason for Updating Bethany's Constitution

Our current Constitution was last updated in 2014 and three churchwide assemblies have been held since the last update. Bethany is behind in these updates and we needed to get back in line with the ELCA overall.

The Process for Changing Bethany's Constitution

Pastor Lucy, Mark Hansen, Judy Zobal and Larry Thome were asked to work through the process for getting the Bethany Constitution updated. We started the review process in late August and after reviewing the latest version of the ELCA Constitution, we determined that it was best to use the latest version as our starting point since the Bethany Constitution was nine years behind in changes.

We compared the Bethany Constitution with the latest ECLA version and highlighted the changes and areas we needed to adjust. We also engaged the La Crosse Synod Constitution representative, Pastor Denny Hallemeier (one of our past Supply Pastors) to guide us through the process.

We created the new version of Bethany's Constitution, received approval from the Synod, and presented to the Bethany Council at the December Council meeting. After their review, they approved moving forward to present to the congregation at the annual meeting on January 21st for a vote of approval.

Congregational Review Prior to the Annual Meeting

The new Bethany Constitution is 30 pages long with 20 chapters. The Constitution will be posted on the Bethany web page, and there will also be paper copies available in the narthex if anyone would like one.

We are also creating a summary document outlining the changes. The majority of the Constitution (16 of the 20 chapters) is required from the ELCA, and there is nothing that can be changed in those sections. We will identify where there are wording changes as well as any governing changes that have been made.

For those interested in seeking additional information, there will also be also be two meetings, one on January 7th and another on January 14th after service during fellowship time to review these changes.

- 1. Call to Order: President Mark Hansen called the council meeting to order at 12:00 p.m.
- 2. Devotions: Pastor Lucy provided devotions.
- 3. Secretary's Report: Shane Gesler made a motion to accept the November 5, 2023 Council meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Inger Kirkwood; motion passed 10-0.
- 4. Treasurer's Report: The November financial reports were presented. Bills are current and paid. Also included was a year-to-date budget with the 2023 expenses updated through November 30, discussed under Old Business. Karl Katuin made a motion to accept the November Treasurer's reports as presented, seconded by Kathie Means; motion passed 11-0.
- <u>5. Pastor Report:</u> Pastoral visits are going on. She attended a conference meeting. East Lemonweir will have a prime rib dinner January 27 -tickets are \$30, and proceeds are going toward their Outreach efforts. For the March 3 Council meeting, council members should plan for an extended council meeting to include a study of scripture and to look to the year ahead with Pastor Dione. February 17 will be Synod Councils Congregational Retreat near LaCrosse. A Mutual Ministry Committee may be created, with members appointed by Pastor and the Council President.

6. Committee Reports:

- a. <u>Education</u>: Sunday School is continuing. Today there were two students for Sunday School, as well as all three confirmation students.
- b. <u>Evangelism</u>: The park nativity display is set up. Thank you to Cindy Costello for touching up those plywood figurines! A new sign was purchased and put up at the display.
- c. Long Range Planning: Nothing new.
- d. <u>Property:</u> Need to check and make sure the windows are all closed as some have trouble latching. The church water heater will be checked due to issues with heating. Parsonage fireplace chimney was sealed up and the wood-burning insert was removed by four people, to be replaced with a new electric insert.
- e. Social Concerns: Thanksgiving baskets were distributed.
- f. Stewardship: No report.
- g. Worship: December 31 service is being worked on. Ash Wednesday 2024 is on Valentine's Day.

7. Old Business:

- a. <u>Constitution Committee:</u> The proposed new constitution was sent to council members for review. Discussion. Karl Katuin made a motion, seconded by Kathie Means, to present the proposed constitution to the congregation for approval; motion passed 10-0.
- b. <u>2024 Budget:</u> Some items and figures were adjusted in the proposed 2024 budget compared to 2023. Connecting the TV to the sound system, having a link to bulletins for services so they can be followed while viewing services online, and updating the website are just three future wish-list items.

8. New Business:

- a. <u>Budget meeting with East -Dec 13 @ 5:30pm</u>: This joint meeting with East will be held December 13 at 5:30pm, just after the Advent dinner starts but before worship that evening.
- **b.** Annual meeting date -January 21: Annual meeting to be January 21 toward end of service that day. An audit checklist will be used by the Audit Committee for reviewing the 2023 financial records. Annual Reports will be due by January 1 to give Betty enough time to get the annual report booklets done.
- c. <u>Nominating Committee:</u> Larry Thome, Kathy Means, and Betty Krotzman are going off council, so they are part of the Nominating Committee who will be looking for new council members.
- d. <u>Christmas Gifts:</u> Inger Kirkwood and Michaele Korbein were asked to step out and close the door so the rest of the council could have a discussion, after which they were invited back in.
- e. <u>Fire Department:</u> Discussion only on a request from the New Lisbon Fire Department for funds to help with fire education.
- **9. Next Meeting:** Next Council meeting will be January 7, 2024 at 12 noon, with Christy Toelle providing devotions. She will also have Sunday announcements for the month of January.
- <u>10. Adjourn Meeting/Closing Prayer:</u> Karl Katuin made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Glenda Swinehart; motion passed 11-0. The Lord's Prayer was prayed in closing. The meeting adjourned at 1:36pm.


