

# A Note from Pastor Lucy



Dear God's Beloved.

During June 7-9, the elected voting members from Bethany and East Lemonweir will join other voting members from area congregations at La Crosse Area Synod's Synod Assembly. If you are not familiar with Synod Assembly, think of it as an Annual Meeting (like our congregations have or even a cooperative business). We will discuss business items (like the synod's mission support budget and compensation guidelines for rostered leaders, and various resolutions about the ministry we do together as a synod), participate in worship, and learn together through workshops.

All of this work will be centered around the theme, "Rooted in God's Love." This theme comes from the second half of the La Crosse Area Synod's mission statement: *Cultivating Life-Giving Relationships Rooted in God's Love.*" Ephesians 3:17 will be the guiding verse for the weekend supported by the Parable of the Sower from Mark 4:1-9.

As I've begun to prepare and pray for Synod Assembly—I have often found myself thinking about what it means to be rooted in God's love. How do I stay rooted? How does being rooted in God's love call me to treat creation, my community, strangers, family, and friends? How does being rooted in God's love empower me to learn and serve?

Roots are important. A plant's root system is a fragile yet strong system of tendrils that all come from a single center root. It not only provides a foundation and stability for plants—but also gathers nutrients. Roots are ever trying to grow deeper and farther in search of the nutrients they need.

Although we humans don't have physical or literal roots, we do have figurative roots. A goal for many of us is to find a place where we can put down roots. We long for a place where we can be nourished and grow--where we can be fed and supported.

We can find those physical places like community and our homes—yet another place where we can find nourishment to grow is God's love. When we dwell or abide in God's love—trusting in the grace and forgiveness God gives us—we are filled with the Holy Spirit to discover, learn, serve, and journey. It is as Paul writes in Ephesians 3:14-21...

<sup>14</sup>For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, <sup>[a]</sup> <sup>15</sup> from whom every family <sup>[b]</sup> in heaven and on earth takes its name. <sup>16</sup>I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit <sup>17</sup> and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. <sup>18</sup>I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth <sup>19</sup> and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. <sup>20</sup> Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, <sup>21</sup> to him be glory in the church and <sup>[c]</sup> in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

Call to Order:	President Mark Hansen called the Council meeting to order at 12:02 PM.
Devotions:	Larry Thome provided a devotion from Pastor Rick Warren - Working Together, We Can Accomplish More. As you walk through life, remember that you're not supposed to do everything on your own. As you share the burden of your work with fellow Christians, you'll find that you actually accomplish more for the glory of God.
Agenda Approval:	Mark Hansen presented the agenda for approval. There were no changes. <i>Christy Toelle made a motion to accept meeting agenda as presented, seconded by Inger Kirkwood; motion passed 10-0.</i>
Secretary's Report: (Larry)	Karl Katuin made a motion to accept the April 7, 2024 Council meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Inger Kirkwood; motion passed 10-0.
Treasurer's Report: (Michaele)	The period ending 4/30/24 General Fund Register, Savings Summary Report and Memorials Balance Summary Report were presented. There were no questions after the review.
	Shane Gesler made a motion to accept the 4/30/24 Treasurer's reports as presented, seconded by Inger Kirkwood; motion passed 10-0.
Pastor's Report:	Pastor Lucy thanked all those who have helped, prayed and provided monetary assistance for those attending the National Youth Gathering Update;
	The Krause family and Barb Pease will be welcomed as new members at the May 19 <sup>th</sup> service. We will have a Confirmation on that Sunday with one Confirmand – Gracie Faber.
	Committee Reports
Discipleship: (Glenda	A couple of new Discipleship ministry are being considered:
and Shane)	An "In-Reach" ministry, which would provide care to the congregation, their friends and their family by providing support in times of trouble, sadness, healing, and joy (e.g. new baby). This could be a meal train or some other kind of assistance.
	Similar to our Salad Luncheon, a possible outreach lunch ministry grilling brats, chips, etc in the July/August timeframe. Something that maybe some of the local companies and businesses could enjoy.
Education: (Deanna)	No new updates the committee.
	Pastor Lucy shared that she has been talking with the Pastor from Winding Rivers Methodist Church about having an ecumenical Vacation Bible School (VBS) this summer (July/August) for K-5 <sup>th</sup> grade children (and possibly their families). This would be based on an ELCA based VBS program and they are in communications with other churches in the area to see if they are interested.
Social Concerns: (Inger/Christy)	Containers are out in the Fellowship Hall for items for the healthcare kits. Toothbrushes, soap and towels are the greatest need for the kits.
	The committee is also looking into baby care kits as another possible social ministry.

## **Church Council Meeting Minutes**

Sunday, May 5, 2024

Property: (Karl)	There was as emergency issue with the parsonage garage door that was addressed, but it may require a new garage door opener.
	The clean-up Saturday was a success even though there was some weather impact. A number of trees that badly needed trimming were addressed and the exterior door by the steeple was fixed by Deanna's husband (Pete).
	There are two outside faucets, and only one is working (by the Fellowship Hall). The one not working may need extensive repair as there is a pipe in the wall and cement that needs replacing, and it's not a simple fix. Karl will be reaching out for quotes to fix this and bring this back to the Council.
Worship: (Larry)	No new updates from the committee.
	Pastor Lucy did provide an update on the outdoor Service on July 7 <sup>th</sup> at Riverside Park.
	This will be a joint service again with Winding Rivers Methodist. Winding Rivers will provide the brats and buns and Bethany/East will provide salads, etc. for the after-service lunch.
	Mark Hansen will be providing music, but we need of a portable sound system for the service.
	Pastor Lucy also mentioned that there may be some minor "tweaks" in the summer liturgy.
	Old Business
Mission Statement Update:	The Council members were reminded that we will be discussing the creation of a Mission Statement at the June Council meeting and that they should do some research into reviewing other churches Mission Statements as preparation for the discussion.
	An example is the La Crosse Synod's Mission Statement, "Cultivating Life-Giving Relationships Rooted in God's Love".
By-Laws:	Larry Thome shared that we received feedback from Pastor Denny Hallemeier regarding our by- laws updates. We made the content changes that he suggested and we agreed that the by-laws would be a separate chapter in the Bethany Constitution, similar to how the past by-laws were maintained.
	As the Council approved presenting these by-laws to the congregation for approval, it was decided that we would do this as part of the June 2 <sup>nd</sup> Service. To allow the congregation to review the new by-laws prior to the vote, we will communicate the changes electronically on our website, Facebook, and have a limited number of printed copies available in the narthex. Announcements will also be made in the bulletins and as part of Sunday Service.
Wa du Shuda Days:	Similar to last year's Wa du Shuda Days, Bethany will have a pie/brownie booth next to East Lemonweir's ice cream booth.
	We will need help in setting up the booth on Friday, July 12 <sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM and also in working in the booth on Saturday, July 13 <sup>th</sup> from 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM.
	Shane Gesler will be creating a sign-up schedule for this event for both pie and brownie making and the booth support.
	New Business
Bethany Website:	Bethany's website needs an upgrade to both the outdated website design and the content (information) on the website. Pastor Lucy met with a website hosting firm named Chapel Sites. This is a new company formed from our current website hosting company, and they agreed to update the website design for no cost if we signed a new contract with them. They provided us with a protype using the content from our existing website and Pastor Lucy shared it with the Council.
	Chapel Sites had multi-year plans at reduced costs, but the Council did not want to go into a multi-year plan until we were comfortable with the overall support and our comfort level with this new company.
	The cost for this website service/support is \$29/month, which is \$348 annually.

	Deanna Smith made a motion to approve the new website provider as presented, seconded by Glenda Swinehart; motion passed 10-0.
·	While the new website hosting company was approved, the content (information) will still need to be updated as much of this information has not been updated in over five years. Larry Thome volunteered to update the website content with information gathered from different resources and people from the congregation before we move to the new design.
WELCA - Church Floor Funding:	Over the course of multiple years, WELCA has been accruing funds designated for the church floor in the sanctuary. The current floor was installed in 1969 when the church was built.
	The current flooring is made of a material that has a long life, and questions came up as the timeline for needing replacement. The floor is in good shape, and the cost to replace the floor would be expensive. It was noted that WELCA does not see this as an immediate need, but wanted the Council to be informed that they could designate these funds if needed long-term.
	Michaele Korbein did mention that with our current flooring needed to be stripped and rewaxed on a regular basis to retain its long life. The last time this was done was at least four years ago by a company based out of Tomah, and maybe we should be looking into this as a short-term maintenance solution.
	Mark Hansen will follow up with WELCA to ensure that Council and WELCA are in agreement with the approach on the sanctuary flooring.
Next Meeting:	The next Council meeting is scheduled for June 2, 2024 at 12:00 PM. Deanna Smith will provide devotions and Sunday service announcements.
Adjourn Meeting/	Pastor Lucy led the Council in a closing prayer.
Closing Prayer:	Glenda Swinehart made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Karl Katuin; motion passed 10-0. The meeting adjourned at 1:46 PM.


